# KENNY LOUIS GRABS 1<sup>ST</sup> AT OTAY NIGHT TOURNAMENT by Frank Neugebauer

#### Night Time is the Right Time at Lake Otay!

We had our first night tournament of the year at Lake Otay on Friday night and it sounded like the fishing was good, for most people. We had a full moon, bug free night with what I can only describe as very favorable conditions. We had some big fish weighed in with one over 10 pounds and another over 8 pounds. More on that in just a minute. We had 32 people fish with a total of 90 out of a possible 96 fish caught. It sounds like Lady Otay was shining her Love Light on the San Diego Bassmasters.



It looks like we had at least six fish weighed in at five pounds or more and it looks like you needed at least one of those to get one of the top six spots. So let us get to who figured it out. Our Otay Night Winner was Ken Louis who brought in an impressive 17.26 total weight for 3 fish. Ken had monster big fish of 10.18 pounds, the big fish in tournament so far this year, along with 2 other fish. One fish did not make it so Ken had 17.01 lbs. net weight for the night. Great job. Second place was captured by "Nick Meyer Everybody" who had three fish anchored by an 8.29 pound toad for a total of 15.24 pounds. Third place was taken by a guy very familiar with the lake, Stu Kenson, who brought three to the scales, with a 6.30 pound kicker, for a total weight of 13.33 pounds. Congratulations to our top three who should be making some space on their trophy wall right now.

There was a little shake up in the YTD standings with several people, myself included, having a not so great points night even though it would have been hard to find a more pleasant night to fish. "Nick Meyer Everybody" has captured first place but Inder and Greg Gardner are very close behind. We have six of ten in the books for points tournaments but there is still a lot that can happen between now and November. Are you going to be one of the anglers we will be talking about at the end of the year? Make it happen!!!

I would like to recognize the team we had for the weigh-in at Otay. We were under pretty tight time constraints to get in, get launched, fish six hours, recover boats, weigh-in, calculate the results, and get out of there in 8 hours. However, Dina Ammsso, Joe DeSalvo, Greg Gardner, and Ed Marr made it happen. Thank you also to Jim Beyrouty who also helped load and



unload the weigh-in tables and scales. Thank you to all participants for being efficient in getting your fish to the scales. (Editor's Note: Complete results can be found at the end of this newsletter.)

### Historical Information about San Vicente Reservoir


From the San Diego County Water Authority:



Raising the height of San Vicente Dam was one of the last major components of the San Diego County Water Authority's Emergency & Carryover Storage Project, helping ensure that water is available to the San Diego region even if access to imported water supplies is interrupted. The Water Authority raised San Vicente Dam 117 feet to store additional water for regional use during times of water scarcity. It is the tallest dam raise in the United States and the tallest dam raise of its type in the world. The reservoir expansion added more than 152,000 acre-feet of water, more than doubling its capacity. The dam raise created the greatest single increase of water storage capacity in San Diego County history. The new water storage capacity serves two purposes. About two-thirds of it is for

capturing surplus water during wet seasons for use in dry years. One-third of the new reservoir capacity stores water for use in a regional water supply emergency, such as an earthquake that cuts off imported water supplies.

San Vicente Dam has been owned and operated by the City of San Diego since its construction in 1943. At the dam's original height of 220 feet, the reservoir could store 90,000 acre-feet of water for city customers. The City of San Diego retains ownership and use of its original storage capacity, while the Water Authority manages the new storage capacity for use by the region. The two agencies share the cost of operating and maintaining the expanded dam and reservoir.



Construction began in 2009 on the foundation of the new dam. To create a good concrete bonding surface between the original dam and the raised dam, the contractor removed two inches of the downstream, or dry, surface of the dam. The concrete mix for the dam raise was custom-designed to match the strength of the original dam, allowing the two sections of concrete to function as one unit. Nearly all the concrete was produced on-site with rocks mined from the hillsides circling the old marina, avoiding 100,000 delivery truck trips through the local community. Daily laboratory tests confirmed that each batch of concrete met strength and performance specifications. Concrete work to raise the dam began in 2011 and was completed in 2012. Working up from the new foundation, the contractor placed roller-compacted concrete in front of the original dam, then continued up an

additional 117 feet. Roller-compacted concrete is just as strong as conventional concrete but takes less time and water. It is placed in layers, one on top of the other, in a process that resembles road construction. The dam raise was completed in 2014, and the Water Authority started depositing water into San Vicente Reservoir for future use in May 2015. In addition, the Water Authority built a new pipeline for the City of San Diego to replace a section that will be under water when the expanded reservoir is full. Also, a new, larger marina was built to replace the former marina. After construction the City of San Diego reopened San Vicente Reservoir to boating and fishing in 2016.

#### **UPDATE ON TERRY!**

Terry writes: I've been asked to update my medical issues. Shortly after the first of the year, I started having occasional pain in my left hip. By the end of February, I had problems with getting my shoes and socks on. My doctors gave me several cortisone shots and physical therapy that didn't work. By mid-



April, I could barely walk and was having extreme pain. In June, I went into the hospital and they found out that I had hip necrosis, which means that blood flow to the femur at the hip wasn't

getting blood and the bone was dying. doctors decided they had to operate in late June and they did a temporary hip replacement, called an antibiotic spacer, to make sure any infection was taken care of before they did the final hip replacement. Since the surgery I am doing very good. All the sutures and staples are out and I can walk with the aid of a walker and best of all most of my pain is gone. The doctor gave me permission to go out in the boat and do some fishing as long as I am very careful in the boat. My final surgery, I hope, will get done in late August and the temporary hip will come out and the final replacement will get installed. Then it will just be rehab and getting ready to fish next year." Thanks for the update, Terry. Keep up the good work and get well SOON.

# San Diego Bassmasters General Meeting July 10, 2018



The San Diego Bassmasters General Meeting was called to order on July 10, 2018 by President Terry Chenowth at 7:05 PM. Bassmasters greeted members and guests.

Cheryl Byrd moved and Ed Byrd seconded that we approve last month's minutes. Motion passed.

**Greg Gardner – Membership Chair:** Greg introduced the guest at the meeting as Bill VanWulven (owner of Barnacle Bill's Bait & Tackle and a member of the Roadrangers), Brandon Kuiehl (prospective member), Gerie Morrin and Victoria and Hunter Meyer. We have 2 prospective members, Evan Esaney and Dina Ammsso who will be voted on tonight. Greg asked each of them to speak to the membership and then excused them from the room while discussion was held and the vote was taken. They were both accepted into membership. With the addition of the two new members, we have 45 active members, 3 family, 2 inactive, 7 lifetime, 8 honorary, 11 at large, and 1 prospective.

Discussion was held regarding ordering new shirts and hats. Ron will look into ordering women's shirts and more long and short sleeved nylon men's shirts. Greg Gardner will take charge of ordering the hats. Joe DeSalvo-Treasurer requested that everyone preorder what they want so that the club is not stuck with an inventory of merchandise. The membership agreed.

**Terry Chenowth – President:** Terry reported on the recent picnic for Ernie Guillen – Vice President who had to leave early. Ernie reported that he felt the picnic was a big success. Thanks to all who helped run all the games, cooked the food, brought side dishes, ran the raffle and make donations. Larry Ward won the Casting Contest and Eric Mack & girlfriend won the Washer Toss. Doris Cook made a suggestion for next picnic that more people need bring non-dessert side-dishes. This year there was only one pot of beans and a couple of salads and fruit. Also brought up was limiting the buy-ins to 1-2 per person for the Casting Contest. Joe DeSalvo recapped the financial end of the picnic as a net expense of \$177. The breakdown is as follows:

**Joe DeSalvo – Treasurer:** Recent expenses were \$117 for trophies, Picnic \$177, Top Six \$50 (requested tonight). Joe did not have the bank total tonight but said the treasury was healthy.

**Frank Neugebauer – Tournament Director:** Frank handed out the trophies for the June 9<sup>th</sup> El Capitan tournament. 1<sup>st</sup> place: Inder Lopez - 18.61 lbs., Ron Overman – 16.82 lbs., Terry Foreman – 16.49 lbs. and Frank Neugebauer with Big Fish of 4.91 lbs. Frank reported that there were 5 dead fish left in a bag at the end of the tournament and reminded everyone that it is their responsibility to take care of their own dead fish.

The sign-up for the Otay night tournament was passed around. The next tournament is on Friday July 27<sup>th</sup> and will be launch and go at 7:30 p.m. There is a 3 fish limit and a 13" minimum. You can run to your first stop on plane and all subsequent moves not on plane. Your lights must be on the boat before you launch and they must be on when you move using the big motor. When moving on the trolling motor, the anchor light must be on. Some type of light must be on at all times while fishing (anchor light or glow sticks). Weigh-in will be at 2 a.m. and we must be out of the gate by 3:30 a.m. Frank will collect the Big Fish money as usual and Joe will collect the permit money tonight. Do not buy your permits at the lake, as it must be included in the check Joe writes to the City. Frank reminded us to use a second bag for a fish over 5 pounds. Don't forget your bug spray!

Break - 8:05 to 8:20.

Pairings were drawn during the break for Otay and Frank announced them after the meeting resumed.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m. by Terry Chenowth.


