Here we are, a new year, new decade, and a new San Diego Bassmasters fishing season about to begin. We have a new schedule, voted in with no drama. Thank you all for that effort. We will be going to our old stand by lakes and returning to Roosevelt in Arizona where we have not been in quite a while. Roosevelt will be a first for me, but I have spoke to numerous Bassmasters that have been there before and all the reports were of good fishing. I have received our permit for the DFW and we are good to go. I am still waiting on the City of San Diego to get the green light on our two night tournaments but there was no conflict when I discussed the dates and sent in the applications.

I am sure everyone has cleaned their reels, spooled up new line, tied on their Christmas presents, bought their

2020 license, and are ready to go. I am looking forward to serving as Tournament Director this year and want everyone to know that I will be doing my best to keep everyone up to date with e-mails regarding pairings, any changes that occur between the meeting and tournament, and getting the results out quickly.

Early update for Roosevelt: Cheryl Byrd gave me information on possible places to stay at Roosevelt. Roosevelt Lake Resort (928)467-2276, their rate for three nights (Wed, Thurs and Fri) was \$87.77/night or \$263.30 Spring Creek RV Resort & Motel (928)467-2888 and their rate for the same dates is \$63.96/night or \$191.88 for fishermen (a 15% discount off their regular rate). Thank you, Cheryl, for finding this information. I would recommend everyone make their reservations as soon as possible or lock in whatever accommodations you are going to use.

Here is a bit of San Diego Lake news that I believe could actually be a positive for us bass fishermen, or should I say fisherpersons. I do not want to be politically incorrect. And no offense to anyone who identifies as either an alphabet person or an inanimate object. There is a huge project going on up at the dreaded Lake Hodges where they are installing some type of aeration system and possibly a water purifier to improve the water quality in the lake. Have no idea what that will all mean for us, but it does not sound bad. Lake Hodges has the purest strain of Florida Largemouth out here. Seeing that lake coming back to where it was in the past would be awesome.

Unfortunately, there was a little bit of bad news regarding El Capitan on the website as well. As Jim Sleight brought to our attention a while back, there does appear to be an issue with the dam. Since the dam was built so long ago, there are concerns about the integrity of the dam. From what I saw, it looks like the city is comfortable with keeping the lake at a level of at least 50 feet below full pool. What that means for us is, no matter how much rain we get, and until it is determined the dam is strong enough to withstand more water in the lake, the Crapper will remain low. We get what we get.

I am looking forward to being on the board and working with all the board members to have a great year for the San Diego Bassmasters. I have talked to Ed, Larry, and Joe who have agreed to be on the weigh in team. Yes, we are putting the band back together. I have also had several other people volunteer to help and as I said in 2018, it was the team we had that made everything work so well. Thank you to all that help.

Do not forget, our club meeting is on 1/7/20 and we will be at El Capitan on 1/11/20 for our fun, aren't they all fun, tournament. I will discuss possibly a little side pot option at the meeting. A little cash always seems to make things more interesting.
