Hello San Diego Bassmasters, we have very good news, we are approved for Lake Mohave. I hope to see you all out there fishing this great fishery. The first points tournament of the year is February 27th at Otoy lake. I will be sending out a sign-up sheet the same day as the zoom general meeting.



### WHAT YOU NEED FOR MOHAVE

1. **AIS deal sticker** - everyone who is going to Mohave must have this to fish Mohave. To purchase a decal, go to [www.ndowlicensing.com](http://www.ndowlicensing.com) and make sure you press "motorized watercraft", cost \$12.00.
2. **Annual fishing license for non-residents cost \$55.00**. Arizona and Nevada fishing licenses both work.
3. You are required to get a pass to enter Katherine Landing Park; you can get one at the gate or online at [www.nps.gov](http://www.nps.gov). I was told if you get to Katherine Landing before 5:00 a.m. you don't have to pay the 15.00 dollar fee because they won't be there yet.
4. Katherine Landing Lodge has rooms and a place to plug in for your boat. I'm sure prices have changed. I would call to get their lodge price.
5. Harrah hotel is another place you guys and girls can stay. They have boat plug-ins at the top of the self parking they charge \$30.00 a night you have to be staying there to use it. My only other option would be to rent a house in Bullhead City so you don't have to worry about finding a plug-in.

Cole Wright – Tournament Director: There is a sign-up happening for our January 30<sup>th</sup> tournament. Get your sign-ups in to Cole before the 18<sup>th</sup>. Our two perspective members will be tournament pre-fished at that tournament, John Taylor, and Bruce Robertson. Sunrise at 6:50, so arrive at 5:30 or earlier. Please read the tournament rules on the website.

You will need your AIS sticker on your boat for Mojave. That's the Nevada Fish and Wildlife sticker for \$12-13, and it arrives by mail, so get that right away. You will also need an Arizona or Nevada license. Cole will also email that info to the club. Our insurance is the last step for approval at Mojave, and is in the works. Zoe reports that they have been very receptive to us at Catherine's Landing.

If you are having problems getting into the website, talk to Jeff Carpenter. Some were having problems with getting the newsletter, and it will be looked into.
