Urgent Call to Action - All BassMaster Members & Friends

Your President Bruce Smith and I have been communicating with several City Council Members and County Supervisors about potential upcoming Budget Cuts.

The SD City Mayor's Budget will be released April 13, 2024. According to our contacts within the city, the greatest number of emails/letters they receive is how they determine what issues are of highest priority to the community and therefore to the Mayor and Council members.

Right now, those numbers have the most affect with the Mayor. We need to flood his Inbox with THOUSANDS of emails EVERYDAY!

Below you will find the Mayors email address and some letters and topics to impress upon him the importance of our issues. If you can't send one every day, how about every other day? Twice a week?

Some say that "we can't make a difference if we aren't SD city residents." WRONG!! The bicycle coalition got together cyclists from all over the county last year and had an email campaign. They got \$18 million because of their efforts. The City Lakes budget for fishing/recreation is below \$2 million. If we can get HALF of the amount the cyclists got, that means we can get our One day a month back and prevent a potential winter closing of several of our lakes.

Do this now or don't complain when you lose lake days and cost goes up.

Will you please secure 2024-2025 Budget funding for the San Diego City Lakes Recreation program to prevent further cuts and support expansion?

Thousands of San Diego residents are concerned the 2024-2025 City Budget will continue to lack funding for Days Open, Recreation and Infrastructure improvements at Lake El Capitan, San Vicente, Lake Otay, Southerland and Hodges. Most of these Reservoirs are in the County but they are part of the City Budget controlled under the PUD. We encourage the city to invest more in these reservoirs for the tremendous economic impact recreation brings to the city/county. We also encourage the County to provide funding.

Specifically, more "betterment" funding allocated to the San Diego City Lakes Operation. More days open, marina, road, docks, facilities improvements and expanding recreation is what thousands of San Diegans that use these Lakes want. The current budget includes millions in capital improvement program funding for parks and enhancements to recreation for San Diegans and visitors. What about the Lakes?

OUR FIRST PRIORITY

- NO MORE LAKE CLOSURES.
- MORE DAYS OPEN. Reversal of "one day a week closures" ..this was done in 2019 and never corrected.....REVERSE THIS ON ALL RESERVOIRS

• Complete Resurfacing the PUD ACCESS road at El Capitan

GENERAL ACTION ITEMS

- More operating days
- Infrastructure projects
- Improved docks
- Concession services and rental boats so families can enjoy.
- Youth free fishing days and events

The city increased the fishing permit and boating fees to access the lakes....where does that money go?

Lack of funding, lack of "betterment" projects, lack of staff, limited days open, closures and cuts economically affect many community businesses and commerce supporting the region. The San Diego City Lakes are an important part of San Diego County local communities and businesses. The additional investment can actually result in more revenue for the City and local Businesses.
